

There are 4 fields (Approximately 600 *tsubo*, or 2,000 m^2) at two separate locations.



Field #1, located at 777 Otogi-cho, is the main cotton field open to the public for viewing, and for participating in planned events that we hold throughout the year.

Field #2, #3, & #4, are located at 4 Takenouchi-cho, which is approximately 10 minutes on foot from Field #1. These three fields are work fields that are also open to the public.

We strive to be of assistance to anyone who is in need: Children who refuse to go to school, adults who are going through social withdrawal, or anyone who suffers from depression. We provide a "place" where one is able to peacefully enjoy nature and face their own heart, mind, and soul.
